Colder Weather is Coming

As every parent who has dressed their child for Trick-or-Treating knows, once we hit the end of October, we definitely start moving into winter weather, even though it's technically still autumn. Students will be going outside to play even on drizzly days, so please make sure that they always have jackets and appropriate footwear. Keep in mind that on cold and frosty or snowy days we will also be outside. Mittens/gloves, hats, snowpants and boots are all a good idea on those days!

If we have extreme weather conditions (e.g., heavy rain, arctic outflow winds), children will remain indoors.

If you feel your child should not go outside due to illness, he or she is probably not well enough to be at school.

If your child wears boots to school, please make sure they have a pair of inside school shoes (plain black) to change into.

If school must close due to inclement weather, we will send an email, post on Facebook and notify Star 98.3 radio station by 7:00 a.m.



Absences

If your child will be absent, please phone or email the school office (cnetzlaw@saintmarysschool.

ca) or report the absence on the school website. If you are emailing, it is helpful if you CC your child's teacher.

We are required to track all absences for funding purposes. If you phoned in the absence, please send a written note when your child returns to school, stating the reason for the absence.

We ask that families refrain from taking children out of school for vacations outside of scheduled vacation times. If you do choose to do so, please be aware that teachers are not required to send homework packages with your child. However, your child may be required to make up work missed upon return.

Well...not really, but this month we are starting to think about things that will be happening in December! Some parent participation opportunities will be shared. Please wait for an email, Facebook post and/or Sign-Up post.

- First, and most importantly, **Advent**. The First Sunday of Advent is December 3rd. All classes have an Advent Wreath in the classroom for prayer time, and we will be needing **two volunteers** to put the wreaths together the week before.
- The Kids Who Can will be making and selling **Advent Candles** again this year! These were beautiful, high-quality beeswax candles their sight and light natural scent really help us to worship with all our senses! Candles are sold in a set of 4 (3 purple, 1 pink) price to be announced shortly. Proceeds go to our **Kids Who Can** foundation, to help support its charitable initiatives.
- Each year the school does a Christmas Lunch for all students and staff. In the past this has sometimes been a turkey dinner, but we have also just done pizza in the past! We will have to make a decision about this year within the next couple of weeks, but in any case we will need **volunteers** to help facilitate this event on and prior to **Wednesday**, **December 13th**.
- Our annual Christmas Shop for St. Mary's students will be held on Friday, December 15th. This
 activity is very popular with our students. The "shop" is stocked with items donated by our
 school families, and each class is given an opportunity to go shopping for
 parents/grandparents. Every item costs \$1.

We will **accept donations** from now until December 13th. Items should be "gently used" and in good condition (no big items please!). Suggestions are tools, picture frames, kitchen items, jewelry, soap/bubble bath, books, ornaments, etc. We will also gratefully accept donations of **gift bags**.

On the day of the event we will need **many volunteers** to help wrap presents.
